	QUALIFYING DRAW REGISTRATION & PAYMENT
	\$80/player, payable at time of online entry.
	Players who qualify for the main draw, or are not selected to play qualifications, will be reimbursed their entry fee.
QUALIFYING FORMAT	 Boys and girls U16 singles. 32 boys, 32 girls 4 boys and 4 girls will qualify for the Main Draw, March 24. Two singles matches will be played on March 22, followed by the final round on March 23 to determine the qualifiers.
QUALIFYING ELIGIBILITY	Players who have competed in the Junior Nationals provincial qualifying process and not gained entry to the Junior Nationals, or players approved by their respective Provincial Association.
QUALIFYING ACCEPTANCE LISTS	Acceptance lists will be forwarded to the Provincial Associations and posted on the Tennis Canada website on March 18. The top 32 ranked boys & girls entered based on the U16 National Bank Rankings as of March 12 will be accepted into the Qualifying event.
	Players <i>not</i> accepted into the Qualifying tournament will be placed on the Alternates list in an order of priority, based on the National Bank Rankings, as per the above criteria.
	Withdrawals from the Qualifying tournament will be replaced with players from the Alternate list.

QUALIFYING SIGN-IN & DRAW	 Sign-in time: for all entered players who are on the Qualifying list and any non-entered players who wish to be considered for the draw, but did not register by the deadline: March 21, 1:00 p.m 4:00 p.m. The above-mentioned players must sign-in on site with the Referee. Players must present their passport information page or permanent residency card at sign-in, to verify their Canadian status. Draw: March 21, 4:30pm. Alternates: the referee will announce a sign-in time for the first day of play for any Alternates who wish to be considered for the Qualifying event, should a potential spot open up due to injury or withdrawal. Players accepted directly into the Singles Main Draw are <i>not</i> required to sign
	in with the Referee for singles.
